Pacific Valley Christian School finished 2024 with approximately 279 enrolments, including 16 Prep enrolments.

Growth is an evident theme in all of this, from student enrolments and building programs to the financial wellbeing of our schools for which we are thankful to God. It is interesting to note that many of our schools are located on land that once was used for farming. Land that was once cultivated to grow trees which produced fruit is still being used to grow things: now children, nurtured and sustained by the Living Water, that they might be fruitful.

We trust that this report gives you an overview of our schools and an insight into the character of our communities, summed up in the name of this group: Pacific. Pacific comes from the

Latin word for Peace the true source of which comes from Jesus who said: "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give you" (John 14:27).

During 2024 there were many different events and activities held at Pacific Valley for the student body and wider community. These events brought the students together and provided them with a place to belong. As two students in the student body we really felt the impact and blessing of these opportunities.



One of the amazing opportunities that Pacific Valley provides the students with is mission trips. In September students from years 9-12 went on a 3 day sport service trip at our sister Pacific Coast Christian School at the Tweed Heads. The students participated in friendly competition for netball, volleyball and soccer. Aswell as helping with primary school classes and in the Pacific Hope and the Gulgangali Jarjums Christian Schools. The trip encouraged kids to connect with the sister schools and build healthy relationships with other students. At the end of November and start of December last year, 9 students were taken overseas to Vanuatu. They spent 4 days on a small island called Marlo playing Australian sports with the kids, building a table and connecting with their community and culture. They then spent a week at Pacific Island Christian School writing letters with the kids to give back to the junior school students at Pacific Valley Christian school, they also painted the school block and built an awning around the toilet block to prevent the doors rotting from rain. This mission trip provided the students with an opportunity

to experience other cultures and connect deeper with other peers as well as growing closer to God and leaning on him through the hardships of being in another country without family.

During this year, we continued hosting Thrive – a worship night aimed at bringing the students and local youth in the area closer to Jesus Christ and aimed to create a fun and safe environment for youth who either attend youth group regularly or who do not. Students enjoyed getting together on a Wednesday night once a term to worship and praise God. The night consists of the students having dinner and building relationship together. After that, the students have fun cheering each other on and engaging in a game. Next, the students engage in worship and sit down to listen to the word.

Throughout 2024, Pacific Valley Christian School has engaged in internal school student community building carnivals, such as the swimming carnival, the athletics carnival, and the cross-country carnival where the school and parents get together to encourage each other and cheer each other on whilst engaging in physical activity and enjoying each other's company and building friendships. The colour run was combined with the cross-country carnival and was a fundraiser for school missions. Pacific Valley Christian School also hosts many Anniversary Picnics and Fairs such as the Christmas carols which encourage wider community relationships and bonding within the community. The school also engages in gala days which include soccer, touch football, netball, and futsal where they compete in a series of competitions with a variety of schools in the area encouraging outer school relationships and separate school communities being able connect.





Accreditation status

All 27 teachers at PVCS in 2024 were at a Proficient status. All teachers have accreditation with NSW Educational Standards Authority (NESA).

Workforce composition

The staff at Pacific Valley Christian school exhibit typical diversity of age, gender and ethnicity. National backgrounds include Anglo, Africaans and European. Teaching staff numbers were at 27 for 2024.

We also employ teacher aides who support students in varying capacities such as numeracy and literacy support groups, 1 on 1 in the classroom and general classroom support. There are administrative staff and staff who are in the finance and maintenance roles.

Description of how school manages student non-attendance

The following is an excerpt from the School Attendance Policy and Procedures document.



Procedures when attendance is an issue

The school takes its attendance responsibilities seriously and will support parents/carers with their child's attendance issues. While parents/carers should be reminded of their legal obligations under the Education Act (1990) the welfare of the student must be the focus of this consultation. We believe that the most effective means of restoring and maintaining regular school attendance includes sound attendance monitoring practices and regular follow-up of unexplained absences by contacting parents promptly. Early telephone contact with parents is one means of achieving this.

Resolution of student attendance difficulties may require a range of additional school-based strategies including:

- 1. Student and parent interviews
- 2. A review the appropriateness of the student's educational program
- 3. The development of a school-based attendance improvement plan
- 4. A referral to the school counsellor or outside agency
- 5. Further support from school-based personnel Heads of School

If a range of school-based interventions has been unsuccessful, support may be requested by referring individual cases of unsatisfactory attendance to the Association of Independent Schools Association (AIS) in conjunction with the principal and heads of school.

Retention Rates

Retention rates for 2024 are reported according to the number of students moving from Year 6 to Year 7, as well as those moving from Year 10 in 2022 to the completion of Year 12 in 2024 at Pacific Valley Christian School.

Year 7, 2024

23 students completed Year 6 at PVCS in 2023. 18 students commenced Year 7 in 2024.

This produces an actual retention rate of 78.26%.

Year 12, 2024

21 students completed Year 10 at PVCS in 2022.

13 students completed Year 12 at PVCS in 2024.

This produces an actual retention rate of 61.90%






INCOME SOURCES







Recurrent/Capital Expenditure
